Uniform

Fleet Wood Lane - Our Uniform

Girls

Red sweatshirt jumper/cardigan

(school logoed or plain)

White or red polo shirt

Dark grey (charcoal) trousers, dress, skirt or school shorts

Red and white checked dress

Red fleece jacket (outside wear)

Boys

Red sweatshirt jumper/cardigan

(school logoed or plain)

White or red polo shirt

Dark grey (charcoal) or trousers or school shorts

Red fleece jacket (outside wear)



White/red polo shirt worn tucked into trousers/skirts

Red logoed (or plain) sweatshirt, jumper or cardigan

Dark grey (charcoal) trousers, or shorts; dark grey school dress or skirt; red and white checked summer dresses

White, black or grey plain coloured socks or tights and black school shoes (no trainers)



Outdoor shoes/wellington boots

As we use the outdoor field at playtimes – in all seasons – your child will need a spare pair of shoes/trainers in school to change into at playtime. Wellingtons are needed in wet/winter weathers, as the field can be muddy.

PE Kit

Plain navy-blue or school logoed T-shirt and navy-blue shorts for indoor lessons.

Children will also need trainers, navy-blue tracksuit or warm navy-blue leggings worn with a plain navy sweatshirt for outdoor games.



Fleece jackets, logoed jumpers/cardigans, logoed PE T-shirts, PE shorts, drawstring PE bags and book bags bearing the school logo, are available from Shotbow1 or www.schooltrends.co.uk. Logoed uniform is not mandatory; plain - supermarket uniform is entirely acceptable.

It is essential that you name label all items of clothing and PE equipment, otherwise it is impossible for us to return misplaced items to their rightful owner. Sewn in name labels are the best - as they don't wash off or out!
